Dear Friends,

For some people, the new discoveries about our solar system and the planet Mars, reveal the wonder of the universe and they see science as a way of learning more about God through understanding what he has created. However, for others, achievements like these demonstrate that God is a delusion and science has removed the need for faith in anything.

There is a perception that science and religion are in conflict with each other. Yet science emerged from solid theological foundations in Christian Europe. Many of the early scientists were Christians, such as Roger Bacon, Johannes Kepler and Michael Faraday. The conflict we hear about today is a legacy of the eighteenth century Enlightenment, which tended to see science as the purest expression of human reason, while any reference to God was at best redundant and at worst a descent into irrationality.

The idea of warfare between science and religion was further promoted by Victorian scientists, such as Thomas Huxley, who wanted to establish a new professional scientific community, free from clerical influence. Today this 'war' is being continued by scientists such as Richard Dawkins and Daniel Dennett.

The loud controversies about ideas such as 'creation science' have obscured attempts by theologians and scientists to find common ground in conversations about religion and science. But, despite the determined efforts of some on both sides to lay sole claim to 'the truth', there is a growing consensus that there is nothing inconsistent between the scientific understanding of the universe and Christian doctrine. Some scientists would go further and argue that the more science discovers about quarks, gluons and electrons, the closer it comes to seeing the mysterious nature of matter as the unfolding of the Creator's plan.

Science and faith are important in areas that affect all of us and ask important questions of us all. Questions like; 'Why aren't there any dinosaurs in the Bible, medicine ('Should we use this new technology?'), and in politics 'Why are we being told to go green eat less meat use less plastic - the world has to end at some point but we don't want to make it a premature end.

The Bible doesn't answer questions like how to get rid of plastic waste but, it does tell us how to care for others and to care for our world. As we approach the season of Lent, please join us in our shared Lent course with members of Our Lady and St. Patrick's church as we look more closely at the words of the Bible and its guidance for our lives.



## Qualifications

A person is qualified to become a Parish Councillor if:

- They are a British subject, or a citizen of the Irish Republic or other Euro national and on the day, they are nominated as a candidate for election.
- They are over 18 and an elector and,
- During the whole of the 12 months preceding their nomination day, or the day of the election, resided or had their principal place of work in the parish or within 3 miles of it.

# Disqualifications

A person may not become a parish or town councillor if:

- They hold a paid office or other place of profit in the gift of the Council.
- They have been declared bankrupt in the past five years and have not repaid their debts.
- They have been convicted of a criminal offence and sentenced to not less than 3 months imprisonment (including any suspended sentence) within the past 5 years.


