St Mary's Church - UPDATE

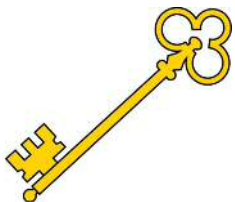

Ministry Team Reflection

In an area of outstanding beauty here in South Devon, what is our image of a perfect 'holiday'? Is it time spent with family and friends on the beach looking out to the glistening waters of the sea? Is it walking the coastal paths with their spectacular scenic views? Or participating in other leisure pursuits and staying in a luxury holiday cottage set in idyllic countryside, like those at Ashcombe?

Did you know that the term 'holiday' as we have come to know it, originated in connection with religious observances? During the Dark Ages and on into the Medieval period of our history the daily workload for most people were as agricultural labourers bound by the feudal system. They were tied to working on their lord's estate, which could be very demanding. With this daily toil the intention of a holiday, a holy day, was to allow the whole community to participate together in religious celebrations associated with important dates within the Christian calendar.

The community that Jesus grew up in also participated in the celebration of 'holy days'. The Jewish Torah refers to them as 'holy [days of] gathering'. Work was not permitted. In addition to the weekly observance of the Sabbath, in the four Gospel accounts of his life in the Bible, Jesus also joins in alongside the rest of his community in the celebration of the Festival of the Booths [where they celebrated their journey to the promised land; and today we enjoy the freedom any day to pray: your kingdom come] [John 7]. The disciples of Jesus accompanied him at the time of the Festival of Dedication [where they celebrated the freedom to worship the Living God in the Temple at Jerusalem; and today we can also encounter the light and life of his presence and power through God's very precious gift of prayer] [John 10]. And the Passover where they celebrated the liberation of God's people from slavery and injustice. Today we can enjoy the freedom in this country to share the Good News that Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life, and through him we can be brought back into a reconciled relationship with God, as our Father in heaven [Matthew 26; Mark 14; Luke 22; and John 13 ff]

Like in most modern societies across the world today, in recent years holidays here in Britain have served as much of a recreational function, like those of any other weekend days or activities. And, as the restrictions following lockdown begin to ease, that each one of us may be open to the prompting of God's Holy Spirit as we engage with and offer hospitality with those visiting this area. To pray that they may also find in their holiday visit, their 'holy days of re-creation', the peace, the rest and the refreshment that God offers to all who call on his name in faith. To respond to the call to: 'Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer'. and to 'extend hospitality to strangers'.

We are now in a position to tell you when our churches will be open for personal prayer.

From Wednesday 24 June

- St Michael's, Teignmouth will be open 10am - 2pm on Wednesdays and Saturdays

From Wednesday 1 July

- St Mary's, Ideford will be open 10am - 4pm on Wednesdays and Sundays
- St John's, Bishopsteignton will be open 10am - 12 noon on Wednesdays & 3 - 5pm on Sundays

Whichever church you normally go to, you are welcome to go into any of these churches at the days and times shown.

You will be able to go into the building to sit in the quiet and stillness of the church to pray and reflect as you wish. All we ask is that you observe social distancing, follow the safety guidance inside the church and clean your hands before and after entering. If you are suffering any symptoms of Coronavirus, please do not enter but seek medical advice.

Before lockdown, the churches in Ashcombe, Luton and St James in Teignmouth were not normally open and the PCCs there have decided that will continue to be the case.

It also continues to be the case that there will be no public church services for the foreseeable future but we will be continuing online services for you to join – they are available at www.haldonteam.org.uk.

There is also a new **Quiet Space** (with resources to use) in the churchyard at St John's in Bishopsteignton which is open all day, every day for anyone to use.

The NHS's 72nd birthday on July 4th and 5th.

NHS England boss Sir Simon Stevens and the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby are among the influential figures supporting the initiative to make July 5th an official day to pay tribute to the NHS and key workers. Clap for carers founder Annet-Marie Plas is also backing the campaign.

Dutch-born Londoner Ms Plas was credited with starting the nationwide applause for NHS staff and key workers, which saw millions of people clapping at their windows and on their doorsteps on Thursday evenings in lockdown. Ms Plas, who called for the event to end in its 10th week and be replaced by an annual event, said: "Now is the time to expand this gratitude and acknowledge everyone who has and is still helping us through this crisis. I hope we can make 5th July a day which unites us in a countrywide 'thank you'."

Justin Welby, the archbishop of Canterbury, said: "My sincere hope is that this weekend will serve as a powerful moment of remembrance, thanks and connection, as we come together and commit to helping to create kinder, closer, more connected communities." He added: "This crisis has in many ways made us more grateful for each other and more indebted to the workers who put themselves at risk to keep our country running and protect the vulnerable. It has shown people at their best – volunteering, helping neighbours, protecting those at greatest risk, pulling together as communities to support one another."

People are asked to put a light in their window on the evening of July 4th, in remembrance of all those who have died during the coronavirus pandemic, and to observe a minute's silence for them.

On July 5th people are being encouraged to return to their doorsteps for a nationwide clap to show appreciation for the NHS and key workers, and also to show people are still there for each other, now and in the coming months and years. If the weather is right, why not stay outside for a little longer and enjoy a drink or a cuppa with friends and neighbours - at a safe distance of course!

Note from editor - I can't find times for the minute's silence or the clap, but hopefully it will be on the news etc nearer the time.

Homeless In Teignbridge Support (HITS) food bank provides support for people in need throughout Teignbridge. People they have helped include those who are homeless, victims of domestic violence, ex-service personnel, the elderly, families in poverty, disabled people, ex-offenders and many others.

At this time the charity is particularly busy and in need of donations - can you help? HITS say that they have had a run of 'starter/new home' packs for people who have had to be re-housed, and also food suitable for children. Although some children have gone back to school there are parents struggling to feed those remaining at home during a period of time when there is limited family income. Libraries phased return from 6th July

From Monday 6th July, we will offer a limited service at four pilot libraries (Braunton, Brixham, Chudleigh and Honiton) and will roll out opening across Devon in the following weeks. We will be operating on reduced opening hours and our phased plan will enable us to operate in a socially distanced way.

Our library service continues online so that our libraries remain open, wherever you are in Devon, and our staff will continue to support our digital library service.

- Maximum number of book loans has increased to 24 books (19/06/20) This is a temporary measure and will be reviewed in December 2020.

Renewals, reservations and charges

- All overdue charges incurred from Friday 20th March onwards have been suspended.
- Please can we request that library customers hold onto books, CDs and DVDs and return them when we re-open. There will be no fines as your current loan period has been extended to the end of August.
- You will be able to view your new return date online by signing into your library account and proceeding to "My loans".

- During this time, online reservations will be unavailable. If you need assistance please email your local library stating your name and library card number.

Temporary road closure

A section of the A382 into Newton Abbot will be closed for two weeks from Monday 22 June.

Devon County Council say the road will be completely closed between Greycoat Lane/Staplehill Road and Whitehill Cross, as part of the ongoing upgrade of the link between Newton Abbot and the A38 at Drumbridges roundabout.

The closure will enable two culverts to be installed under the road. The road will be closed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, although access will be maintained for residents only.

Our quota is seven. In normal circumstances, if a Councillor is unable to attend, we would still have a quorum, at present, this would prevent a meeting from taking place!
