However, the ability to find God in all things comes with practise therefore, times set apart and places like Mill House help us to practise listening and seeing God in a way that isn't sometimes possible, given the world we live in. ## TEAM IDEFORD ARE BEST IN DEVON

Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> June was a momentous occasion for Ideford, when the competition team won the Devon Association of Ringers Major Final!

It was back in September last year that I first mooted the idea of setting up a new competition team based at Ideford with the "deal" being that we would get the bells ringing regularly on a Sunday. David, Anne and the local ringers enthusiastically agreed and we duly started our Sunday ringing the following month.

It has been wonderful to have so much support from the local parishioners with regular "applause" and "enthusiastic comments" after each session. It has also been great to see Anne Rigby-Jones (captain of the tower) at some of our ringing sessions and for her to comment on the "high standard of ringing" - praise indeed!

The Major final is the most prestigious six bell competition in the Association calendar. This year it was held at Ashreigney, North Devon and followed three qualifying heats held in May with the top twelve teams in Devon earning the right to compete at the final and the chance to win the historic "Ross Shield" first awarded in 1925.

In a day of high drama, excitement and emotion, team Ideford took the Ross Shield and also the Jack Hine trophy for the best sequence of changes. Shaugh Prior were a very close second, beaten by just 1 fault!

This was certainly the highlight of my ringing career and I know this sentiment is shared by team member Scott Adams who, having rung for a number of teams over the years, finally managed to win the Major Final after 30 years of trying! Also in the team were Colin and Kate Avery (father & daughter), Steven Came and Phil Morse.

I can speak for everyone in saying that we are all thrilled with this achievement; a day that will never be forgotten! Here's to Ideford 2018 and continuing to work together in the future.

## A Timely Message from Devon County Council

As the summer months return and people spend more time enjoying the countryside, Public Health experts in Devon are encouraging the public to be 'tick aware'. Ticks are small spider-like creatures that feed on the blood of animals, including people. They are found in woodland, grassland and moorland where there is a dense vegetation layer and can be found in some urban parks and gardens. Ticks don't jump or fly, but they attach themselves to animals or people as they brush past something the tick is on. Adult ticks are more active in late spring and summer.

Some ticks may carry an infection which is passed on through a bite. This can include Lyme Disease, although not all ticks carry Lyme-causing bacteria, and not all bites from an infected tick result in Lyme Disease. Lyme disease can be treated effectively with antibiotics, but if it is not treated or if there is a delay in treatment, it can lead to complications.

People may experience mild flu-like symptoms including fever, headache and tiredness. Sometimes people develop a 'bulls-eye' rash but not everyone develops this rash.

### **There are some simple steps to reduce the chances of getting a tick bite:**

- Walk on clearly defined paths to avoid brushing against vegetation
- Wear light colour clothing so you can see ticks and brush them off
- Use an insect repellent that can repel ticks
- Wear long trousers and long-sleeved tops to reduce the direct exposure of ticks to your skin

Ticks are very small and their bite is not painful so you may not realise you have one attached to your skin. After you have enjoyed your walk, do a tick check to make sure there are none attached to your skin, by looking and feeling for ticks. Look out for anything as small as a speck of dirt or freckle.

Anyone who feels unwell after a tick bite should contact their GP and remember to tell them you have been bitten by a tick.

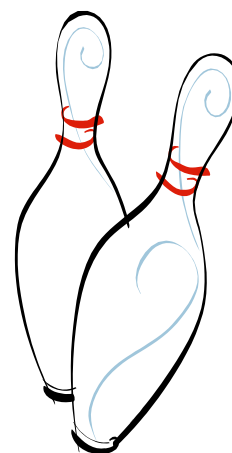
