It is appreciated that there is a need to park partially on the pavement in certain parts of the Parish. However, concerns are still being raised by Parishioners about the complete blocking of the pavement or difficulty in receiving deliveries or transiting around the Parish in farm vehicles. Parking completely on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs.

Please park with care and consideration especially near road junctions, in the more narrow areas of Ideford Village and in the Village Hall and Church area of the Parish.

Broadband & Mobile Phone Update



In response to a letter from the Parish Council, Councillors were given the opportunity to meet with Anne Marie Morris MP on 12 Jun 15 to discuss the lack of adequate superfast broadband throughout the majority of the Parish and the potential withdrawal of the Vodafone ROSS Project because of it.

Providing evidence of need, taking comments collated from the Community Led Plan Questionnaire and providing a list of options and ideas from extensive research, our MP felt that this was a good case of how the system can fail or overlook rural communities.

The letter and case documentation has now been sent to the Devon County Council Portfolio holder for comment and has also been sent to the Secretary of State with responsibility for this matter.

However, to help provide evidence to BT of interest and requirement for Superfast Broadband in the Parish, Councillors would be grateful if as many households as possible (and more than one individual from a household can participate) could complete a Superfast Fibre Broadband Expression of Interest Form on the BT Openreach Website.

STAY SAFE IN THE WATER THIS SUMMER

Recently a swimmer became exhausted while in the Teign estuary. The hard fact is he could have drowned if he hadn't been spotted by a local councillor who got him into a boat. The sea and estuary is very tempting in the hot weather, but dangers exist more so for visitors who may well be adept swimmers in their local pool with its warm water, but conditions in the sea will be quite different. Local people tend to know the dangers, but please, make sure visitors understand the dangers and make their stay safe and enjoyable.

Likewise if you use boats, kayaks, canoes or paddleboards, ensure you don't exceed your abilities and give this advice to visitors. Always wear a lifejacket or a buoyancy aid, make sure your engine is in good order and you have sufficient fuel, tell someone where you are going, understand the local weather and tides, don't overload your craft, don't set out to sea if you have been drinking, carry a waterproof VHF radio for help if you travel out of sight of others, if you capsize stay with the craft as it is a more visible target for rescuers, don't attempt to swim to shore, try and get your body partially out of the water by clinging to your craft which will increase survival time if the water is very cold. Finally, if you have a power boat or jet-ski, do not speed in the harbour area. Enjoy the water and stay safe.

On a happier note, I spent some time with the Bishopsteignton Beaver colony at Radway Hill scout hut to talk about the Countryside Code. The youngsters gave some really well informed responses to questions posed. They know you shouldn't park to block a gate or narrow a road to prevent agricultural machinery getting past, to keep dogs on a lead especially during lambing, to avoid fields with cattle, to keep to the marked route, not to interfere with farm implements or enter farms without invitation, to close a gate after opening it, to use stiles and gates rather than risk damage to yourself and property by climbing walls and fences, to take all litter home, not to light fires, advise someone of your route & plan your route, have a fully charged mobile 'phone, to give way to horse and walkers if you are on a bike or a vehicle, protect wildlife and the environment and wear appropriate footwear and clothing.

The kids knew the answers and I'm hoping their parents will listen to their advice!

DOORSTEP SELLING

Doorstep selling is when someone sells you goods and services in your home or on your doorstep. There are legitimate doorstep traders, but there are rogues that offer poor value and pressurise people, usually elderly or vulnerable, into buying. Sales tactics used can include: You're made to feel grateful. You're made to feel that you have lots in common. You're made to feel as if there is a great sense of urgency. You're made to feel committed to the service-and that you will lose face if you don't buy. You're made to feel that you will be just as happy as other contented consumers. You're made to feel as if the service is endorsed by an expert.

- Tell them you don't buy services at the door.
- I'd like more time to think about it.
- I want to shop around and get other quotes.
- I have to discuss it with my partner/son/daughter.

If the trader is offering to carry out work to your house or garden then they need to give a written quote and a 7 day cooling off and cancelling period which should also be given in writing. Do not pay anything in advance. Do not agree to the trader starting work immediately. Be wary of special offers or warnings about your home like a defective roof. Talk to someone you trust for a second opinion. Goods traders sell items like cleaning materials. They can be poor quality and purchased more cheaply at shops or supermarkets. Don't be swayed by a tale of woe.

There is an unpleasant crime called distraction burglary. One caller keeps you talking at the door while another attempts to enter your house from the rear. Ensure the rear of the house doors are closed and locked if you get an unexpected caller.

Can people parking in Church Road please consider pedestrians? The road is narrow in parts and drivers have taken to parking on the pavement. This is causing great inconvenience to pedestrians, particularly those pushing prams or using a wheelchair/walking frame. Pavements are for people not additional parking. Please either use your driveway or park elsewhere. Do not block the pavement or park in such a way to restrict traffic.

Take care and stay safe.
