So I held on tightly but surprisingly, all appeared comparatively calm and there were so many other boats bouncing around enjoying the sunshine and the excitement of welcoming this old sailing ship. Flags flew everywhere and I began to relax and take in this new experience. And then the Jolie Brise began its sail into Teignmouth harbour and as we took our place alongside this very beautiful ship, I slowly realized what an amazing moment this was and why my friend had made me get into her boat. The sheer grandeur of the Jolie Brise in full sail could only really be appreciated alongside her as we accompanied her into Teignmouth harbour.

So why am I sharing this with you? Well sometimes our inner worries, in this case sea sickness, prevent us from really living life to the full. Sometimes we have to take risks and do things that we have not experienced before, and in so doing we see something or do something pretty wonderful. Added to that, we need to trust others to know better. In this case it was Sue whose quiet insistence allowed me to make peace with the sea, enabling me to experience a truly amazing event. Taking risks allows us to glimpse a part of God's world otherwise hidden from us. It hopefully helps us to trust a little more and makes it easier for the next time when we are presented with something we dread or find difficult. There is no doubt that we will only see the marvellous world that God has created for us and through us, if we are prepared to leave behind our insecurities and our fears. And didn't Jesus say I came that you may have life, and may have it abundantly, John 10:11. 'Open', a song written by Mike Scott, helps us to imagine the world that God wants us to explore and in so doing find Him.

## The Way Forward

*The PCC met in June to respond to all the suggestions made at the community meeting held in March, as to how we can encourage more participation in our 2 beautiful churches. In particular, we wanted to reflect the stated wishes from the meeting to reduce any duplication in services on particular Sundays, increase the opportunities for less formal worship and increase the number of services where the communities of Ideford and Luton combine their efforts.*

You will see from the plan of services, printed elsewhere in this edition of the Parish Magazine, that we have implemented the following changes with immediate effect:

- There will only be one service each Sunday across the 2 churches, creating the opportunity for combining together our collective worship.
- The Village Worship service in Ideford, that has been a part of the pattern of services for very many years, has been withdrawn and ideas are being developed to offer a midweek after school opportunity for children and families to be involved in a simple faith based meeting.
- The 5th Sunday services, when they occur, will alternate between the 2 churches, with transport being offered to encourage support from both villages to this new approach. This begins in July with a service in Luton on July 31 and these 5th Sunday services should be the opportunity for experimenting with different styles of worship.
- The 2 Communion services on the first and third Sunday of the month, will continue at Ideford with a continuing development of a more informal, all age based communion for the whole family on the third Sunday.
- The wonderful response to the initiative of a Messy Church has encouraged the PCC to wish to continue to financially support this new approach and the next event is in Ideford Village Hall on July 6th. Everyone welcome.

As you can see, the PCC has listened to the views expressed about change but these will only be successful if there is support from you all. So please come along to services and join in.

The PCC are acutely aware of the financial challenges we are facing in keeping both churches open and will continue to look at ways of financial support by using the buildings for other activities.

The PCC would like to assure you of our ongoing determination to listen to you and your thoughts on how worship should continue in this parish.

### **Wheat and dairy free Mocha Brownies**

Ingredients:        150g dairy free plain dark chocolate  
                          100g dairy free spread  
                          1tsp strong instant coffee  
                          1tsp vanilla extract  
                          100g ground almonds  
                          175g caster sugar  
                          4 eggs, separated

#### **Method:**

1. Preheat oven to 180degC. Grease a 20cm square cake tin and line the base
2. Melt the chocolate and spread in the microwave. Stir occasionally until the chocolate and spread have melted and are smooth
3. Leave the chocolate mixture to cool slightly, then stir in the coffee and vanilla extract. Add the almonds and sugar and mix well until combined. Lightly beat the egg yolks in a separate bowl, then stir in the chocolate mixture.
4. Whisk the egg whites in a large bowl until they form stiff peaks. Gently fold a large spoonful of the egg whites into the chocolate mixture, then fold in the remainder until completely incorporated.
5. Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin and bake in the preheated oven for 35-40 mins, or until risen and firm on top but still slightly gooey in the centre. Leave to cool in the tin, then turn out and cut into 12 pieces.

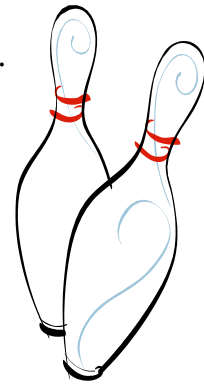
