NEPAL EARTHQUAKE DEC APPEAL DAL BHAT LUNCH

As we have spent nearly 3 amazing months in Nepal trekking and enjoying the loving hospitality of the Nepalese, we feel that we have to do something more for the DEC Earthquake Appeal. Although millions have already been raised, we know from having spent time in Nepal that the recovery from this earthquake will need to go on for years. Many people have lost everything; homes & loved ones. We stayed for several days in the village of Langtang which has been totally flattened by the earthquake with very few survivors. Nepal has always been a very special place to us. So, we will be offering a traditional Nepalese lunch (Dal baht) on **Saturday 13th June** in the Village Hall from **12 - 1.45pm**, adult £5, child £3. 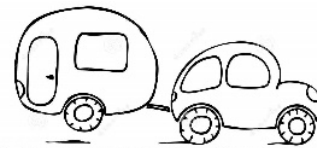

Electoral Review of Devon

The independent Local Government Boundary Commission for England is asking people across Devon to comment on proposed new electoral arrangements for Devon County Council.

The Commission is carrying out an electoral review of Devon County Council to provide for 'electoral equality'; that means each county councillor representing approximately the same number of electors.

The Commission must also have regard to community identity and interests and providing effective and convenient local government. The draft recommendations propose new electoral divisions, division boundaries and division names across the County.

The draft recommendations and detailed interactive maps are available on the Commission's website at www.consultation.lgbce.org.uk and www.lgbce.org.uk. Hard copies of the Commission's report and maps will also be available to view at local Council buildings and libraries.

The types of questions the Commission is asking residents at this stage are:

Do the proposed electoral divisions reflect local communities?

How do you think the proposals can be improved?

Are the names of the proposed divisions right?

How does this affect the Parish of Ideford?

Currently, our County Councillor is responsible for the whole of Kingsteignton, Ideford and Teigngrace. Under the draft recommendations, the new Electoral District would be called the "Teigntons" and would cover the whole of Kingsteignton and Bishopsteignton with Teigngrace moving to a different district.

Residents have from 12 May to 6 July 2015 to have their say about where division boundaries for Devon should be drawn. The Commission will consider all submissions and aims to publish its final recommendations in September 2015. Once the Commission agrees its final recommendations it will lay a draft order in both Houses of Parliament. Parliament will then have 40 days in which to consider the recommendations. If both Houses are satisfied with the recommendations, the draft order will be 'made' and the new divisions will come into effect at the county council elections in 2017.

The Commission wants to hear as much evidence as possible in order to develop final recommendations for Devon County Council. If you would like to make a submission to the Commission, please write to:

Vodafone Rural Open Sure Signal programme

Ideford Parish Council would like to provide a short update on the Vodafone Rural Open Sure Signal programme designed to bring reliable Vodafone 3G coverage to our community. Having carried out several surveys in the village of Ideford, Vodafone Technical Teams continue to work with the Parish Council to ensure Open Sure Signal technology will perform optimally in our community and that the units will be effective in providing widespread coverage.

The recent delays to the project are due to BT issues surrounding Internet upload speeds and the additional telephone lines required to service each of the units. The Parish Council would like to record its thanks to the two potential sites for allowing the progression of this project and for their patience while the current issues are rectified or an alternative is sought. Due to this and other issues surrounding effective broadband connectivity, Ideford Parish Council is now also in touch with Anne Marie Morris MP regarding the provision of super-fast broadband to rural areas and the Connecting Devon and Somerset roll out.

DON'T DROP YOUR GUARD THIS SUMMER

With the recent spell of very welcome warm weather has come an opportunist burglary at a Shaldon property. A window was left open when the householder went out and the thief took full advantage and burgled the property. In the spring and coming summer months, it's natural to want to open windows, but please, do remember to close them when you go out or go to bed. Also, if you are in the back garden, is the front of the house secure? Remember, close windows at the front of the house if you are occupied outside in the rear garden and make sure the front door is secure. On a personal level, when you leave your coat at home because it's so warm, make sure your wallet or purse are secure when you are out and about and keep your mobile phone in view and don't place it down somewhere where someone could pick it up. On the beach, keep an eye on your bag and avoid "stashing" your bag somewhere like an upturned moored boat if you feel like a dip. Someone could be watching. When you park the car make sure all the windows are up, the doors are locked and, if applicable, the roof is closed. Don't leave bags, coats and equipment on view in your parked car; put them in the boot out of sight.

This time of year brings out more horse riders and cyclists on the rural roads and summer will bring a large increase in general traffic. If you are a motorist, please show some patience towards cyclists and horse riders. They are slower moving and therefore vulnerable. Horses are animals and can be spooked by a car driving too close or the driver showing impatience. Horse riders will and should make efforts to let cars by, but show patience if you are motorised. Cyclists should avoid riding 2 abreast if they know by doing so it is slowing the progress of a motor vehicle. Motorists should avoid careless overtaking leaving the cyclist to take avoiding action that could leave him or her vulnerable.

The boats have been craned in at Polly Steps, but prior to that, the area has suffered some marine crime. When leaving your craft take easily removed items with you, take the auxiliary engine off your boat & your tender and avoid leaving the fuel tank full of fuel, not always convenient, but better than having it stolen. Take any oars with you and consider deflating inflatable tenders. Report any suspicious behaviour on the mooring and quay and such areas, remembering there will be many visitors to the area this summer and some will not have our best interests at heart.

Here's to a long, hot, peaceful crime free summer in this beautiful part of the UK.

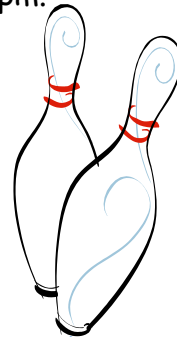
