Corpus Christi, Thursday 15 June 2017

Corpus Christi, which means the body of Christ, or Thanksgiving for Holy Communion, is usually celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but sometimes celebrated on the Sunday after the actual feast day which this year will be Sunday 18 June.

So how did this particular celebration become part of our church calendar? Surprisingly, it wasn't until 1208 when Juliana of Leige received her vision of a full and bright moon, but the moon had a dark spot on it. The same vision recurred, again, and again. Juliana prayed long and hard about the vision she was receiving and finally Christ interpreted it for her. The full moon was the church's calendar, full of brightness and light with the celebration of many festivals. But one part of the moon remained dark...one festival was missing...there was no celebration to remember the institution of the Lord's supper. Juliana hastened to her Bishop and told him about her visions and, as it happened, he soon became a Pope, Pope Urban IV, at her continued request, he decided to institute the festival of Corpus Christi in the year 1264. For the Anglican church, Corpus Christi was added to their Church calendar as late as 1980.

Holy Communion, the Eucharist, The Mass, The Lords Supper, The Divine Liturgy are all names used to describe the sacrament that Christ left us. Theological debates within all these traditions have raged across the centuries over what actually happens when we celebrate Holy Communion. Debates such as, is it just a memorial, a symbol...to... it is the actual body and blood of Christ, and, as a result, deep divisions between the different opinions and denominations of the Christian Church now exist and exclude those who disagree with one opinion or another, making it sometimes impossible for us to share each others' celebration of communion and yet, the most important commandment that Christ left us, was to love one another as he loved us, so clearly reflected in the very sacrament itself.


Christ himself gave us the Institution of Holy Communion and commanded us to celebrate in memory of Him. It is a moment of profound intimacy when we come to the altar and receive the bread and wine, profound at that moment because we tangibly connect with our Lord himself...we commune with him at a level that is both intimate and divine by receiving his body and his blood. It is a moment of silence, a standing still before the throne of God in awe and wonder. Furthermore, we do this in the company of other, we gather around the altar and become the body of Christ for each other and as a community. We become a eucharistic community across the Haldon Mission Community as we are fed at each of our altars with Christ's Spirit who sends us out to do his work in the world.

For me, the sacrament of Holy communion is the jewel within our faith. Its multi-faceted light, reflecting the beauty of God in Christ in all its mysterious layers has shone and still shines across the centuries. We will never fully understand the mystery of what takes place within the eucharist but Our Lord himself has asked us to continue to celebrate this sacrament in memory of Him. This fact is surely enough for us to continue to do so, and, as we do so, we will come to know more and more the gifts he gives us through this most Holy of Sacraments.

you have given us the memorial of your passion:
grant us so to reverence the sacred mysteries
of your body and blood
that we may know within ourselves
and show forth in our lives
the fruits of your redemption:

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and forever.

Whenever possible, items deposited will be reused or recycled

In line with the new contract, the following items will **NOT** be accepted through the Rural Skip service and will instead need to be taken to one of the Devon County Council run household waste and recycling centres (when charges may apply). The nearest centre is on Brunel Industrial Estate, Newton Abbot:

Dead pets and animals	Food waste	Garden waste
Demolition & construction waste	Plastic window or door frames (with or without glass)	Bath or shower tray (plastic, fiberglass or composite)
Plastic pipes, guttering, fascia etc.	Soil & rubble including tiles & sanitary ware	Shower screen (glass or plastic)
Insulation materials	Roofing felt	Trade waste
Oils & other liquid wastes including household chemicals	Hazardous waste including fluorescent tubes	Toxic waste

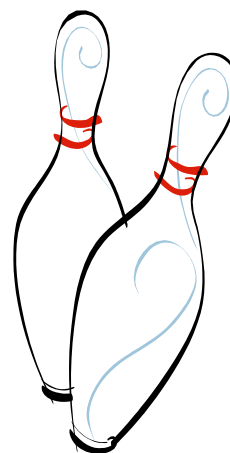
