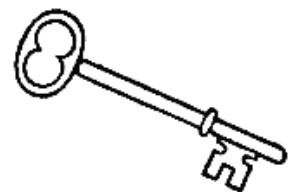

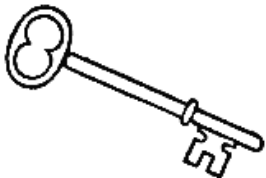

Closing Date for Applications - 30th Nov 16

If eligible, the Connecting Devon and Somerset (CDS) scheme will provide a subsidy of up to £500, in the form of a voucher code, to fund the installation of a new broadband connection. Each premise can choose a supplier from those listed on the CDS Website, with every solution guaranteeing a minimum of 10Mbps download speed. The voucher scheme will run up until 31st March 2017, although applications must be submitted by 30 Nov 2016.

Individuals must approach the suppliers on the Voucher Scheme for further details of their services and decide on the best fit with their requirements.

Key points:

- Anyone who is not yet able to receive consistent broadband speeds of over 2 - 2.99 Mbps may be able to get connected through the CDS voucher scheme.
- The scheme is open to all and not just business customers.
- Approved providers on the CDS List commit to deliver at least a 10 Mbps solution.
- Applications should be submitted not later than 30th Nov 16 (for use by 31st Mar 17).
- You can apply and receive a voucher (but may then chose not to proceed).
- Any premises connected through the scheme would still be eligible for later extensions of the broader CDS programme.

The process to get a £500 Voucher Code is as follows:

Step 1

Check eligibility and apply online - You (homeowners, business owners and groups of home owners) will need to certify that you live or work inside the Connecting Devon and Somerset programme area and that you are currently unable to receive download speeds greater than 2Mbps. If eligible, you can apply using the following:

Step 2

Verification & Approval - CDS will confirm that the premise receives less than 2Mbps and check the location against the current CDS rollout. If your premise is likely to benefit from superfast or significant uplift as part of the current programme, CDS would encourage you to consider waiting for the programme to deliver rather than binding yourself into a contract at potentially lower broadband speeds.

Step 3

Choosing a supplier - If eligible, you are granted a voucher code that can be used to subsidise the costs of installing a broadband technology chosen by you to suit your property. For a list of suppliers go to:

Step 4

Agree an installation - Having decided on a supplier, you must contact them to agree an installation date. When completed, the supplier will notify CDS and CDS will honour the voucher connected with your new service installation.

During November, each household will receive a letter and questionnaire issued in partnership with Devon Communities Together (DCT). Whether you consider yourself in need or not, the information you provide is very important, so please spend a few minutes filling in the form. The information provided will greatly assist decision making by the Parish and District Councils.

None of the information provided on the form will be disclosed to the Parish Council, and will only be seen by DCT staff. No data published in the final report will identify any individual.

If you know of someone who has had to move away because of the cost of local housing, please make sure they hear about this survey. NOVEMBER UPDATE FROM PCSO WILL HEATHER

As we head towards the winter months, with the nights drawing in earlier, ensure your property is secure and protected from a potential opportunistic burglar. It is often seen where there are too many houses in total darkness, showing a property is not occupied.

I would recommend simple products such as time switches which are set for lights to come on and turn off at certain times; giving the impression a property is occupied. These are particularly useful if you are intending to go away on holiday.

If you know or are concerned for a family member, friend or relative, the Devon & Somerset Fire Service provide free 'home fire safety checks' and can assist with installing smoke alarms in a property. They are contactable on: 0800 0502 999 or by email at: firekills@dsfire.gov.uk

On a separate note, with weather conditions changing, make sure your vehicle is ready for the road. Follow the 'FLOWER' acronym and try to do them as frequently as possible.

- F - fuel
- L - lights
- O - oil
- W - water
- E - electrics
- R - rubber
