

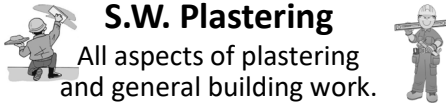

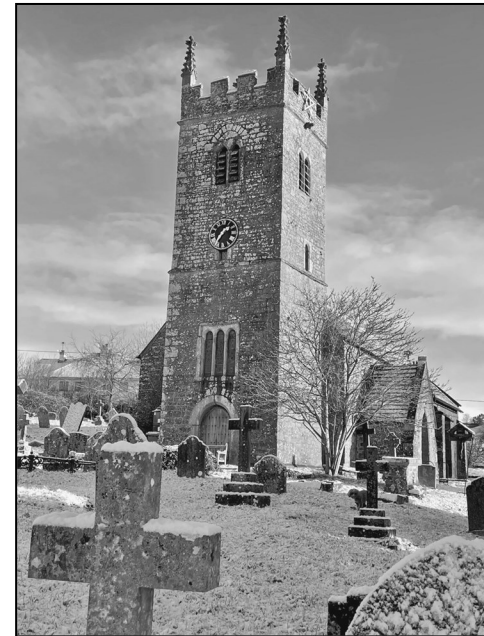

Dear Friends

As another year draws to a close as always there have been high and low points.

We have become grandparents for the first time which is such a joy especially as we lost our much-loved retriever Baloo a few weeks before aged nearly 16. But then life is full high points and less good points. The Olympics and Para Olympics were a great event to watch as we witnessed people working with such dedication and camaraderie to achieve personal dreams. Then there's been the continued war in the Ukraine and Middle East with some heart-breaking scenes - it is a real challenge to think about celebrating Christmas against the back drop of such bloodshed in Jesus' own lands.



How do we reconcile this as we come to celebrate Christmas? Jesus was born into a messy world a refugee far from the comforts of home in a cold and draughty stable. Through his life he was always kind and helpful to others, but he met an end like many in Israel/Palestine today in violent suffering. He didn't use one of his "super powers" to escape what it is like to be human but instead went among people continuing to be compassionate although the authorities didn't want this and were scornful and brutal. He made a difference despite violence and cruelty.

In the DR Congo people have faced or perpetrated the most horrific violence. In a peace centre built there it's leader Bisoke Balikenga says government and leaders have failed and brought people to despair. "They are finding that only Jesus can change them, heal their trauma and give them hope....For only Jesus never leaves us."

I really hope you have not experienced troubles this year, but whatever happens in your life Jesus' love is there for you call upon him in prayer. Christmas is so special because a newborn baby helps to reorientate us- its vulnerability and perfectness bring out gentleness in us. Jesus is often closest to us at Christmas - we can just sit and ponder the crib. When all other "human inspired" solutions fail there is always Jesus to walk alongside us and give us grace and healing.

I wish you and you family and friends a most blessed and joyful Christmas. With love in Christ,

Sustainable Ideford A - Z.

X is for Xmas 2024



We are not quite at X yet in our alphabet but can't miss this seasonal opportunity to offer advice on how to have a Christmas that is as sustainable as possible.

Presents

While it's tempting to go overboard when it comes to Christmas gifts, it's worth resisting if you want to be more conscious of your impact on the planet and how ethically gifts are made. Check out your Christmas present list. With so many under the pressure of time or money, suggest kids only Christmas presents or a Secret Santa for the wider family.

Cards

It is estimated that one billion Christmas cards end up in the bin each year. Try culling your list or consider donating what you would have spent to a charity instead. Make sure you recycle your received cards after Christmas or recycle them as labels for next year.

Many charities are now offering e cards which are bound to be popular now that a 1st class stamp can cost £1.65. The charities give you the option of donating the saving or simply making a charitable donation. Try dontsendmeacard.com and similar companies where you can choose your card and also which charity you want to support.

Wrapping

Use last year's recycled paper or buy a recycled variety of wrapping paper or simply wrap presents in brown paper and a reusable ribbon or natural decoration. Alternatively try Furoshiki - the Japanese art of using fabric, scarves and even tea towels - to wrap your present. Lots of ideas for this on YouTube. Maybe invest in some colourful fabric squares for wrapping future gifts. These can be retained by the receiver or returned to the giver and used again and again.

Lights

Lessen the impact of Lights. Consider solar powered or Led options to minimise the energy needed.

Trees

If you choose to buy a real Christmas Tree make sure it's grown in Britain. Look out for the British Tree Growers Association mark or FSC certification. If you buy a rooted tree and look after it well your tree can be reused for years to come. If your Christmas tree is fake try and make it last at least 10 years. After Christmas, if your tree does not have roots, make sure it is recycled and turned into wood chips. Check with Teignbridge Council website for details.

Food

Use ingredients such as sprouts, cabbages, leeks, pears and cranberries all of which are seasonal in December. Buy locally when possible. Go easy on the cling film (it can take years to decompose. Minimise waste. Buy only what you need; be creative with leftovers and if you've bought too much give what's spare to local food banks. HITS (Homeless in Teignbridge Support) in Kingsteignton or THAT Foodbank in Newton Abbot.

Decorations

Avoid plastic and glittery decorations on your wreath or tree.

Avoid sequins on your Christmas outfit (they are made from pvc and there are no biodegradable substitutes).

Crackers

Try to make your own. They are often shipped from China and filled with plastic items that will only get thrown away. Use toilet roll middle and start listing your best jokes or better still a sustainable question.

Stop and think:

Do we need this? Does the recipient need this? Is it sustainable? Is there a better option?
